## **MARCUS DUBOIS KING**

Marcus DuBois King, Ph.D., is a Research Analyst in the Environment and Energy Practice at the Center for Naval Analyses where his work focuses on climate change issues. King has served as Research Director of the Sustainable Energy Institute (SEI), working with large corporate energy producers and consumers to promote dialogue on clean energy policies and technologies. Prior to SEI, King was Senior Manager for Energy and Security Programs at Numark Associates, a D.C.-based consulting firm. King held three politically-appointed positions in the Clinton administration. From 2000-2001 King was Foreign Affairs Specialist to the Deputy Under Secretary for Environmental Security at the Department of Defense (DoD). At DoD, King served as a member of the U.S. Delegation to the Sixth Conference of the Parties to the Framework Convention on Climate Change. From 1994-1997, King was Research Assistant to the Deputy Secretary and Under Secretary of the Department of Energy. King has served as Globalization Planning Fellow in the Office of the President at Georgetown University and as adjunct professor at Georgetown and George Washington Universities. He is a recipient of the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service. King received a B.S.F.S. from Georgetown University and an M.A. and Ph.D. in International Relations from The Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University.
