## **ELIZABETH TURPEN**

Dr. Elizabeth (Libby) Turpen is co-director of the Cooperative Nonproliferation Program at the Stimson Center, which encourages U.S. and international action to secure WMD materials, dismantle existing weapons and develop the capacities necessary to effectively govern dual-use technologies. Dr. Turpen brings Senate experience and a background in national security, nuclear weapons and nonproliferation issues to the Center. Dr. Turpen's previous employment was with Senator Pete V. Domenici (R-NM) as a legislative assistant responsible for defense, nonproliferation and foreign affairs. Prior to coming to Washington in 1998, she was a consultant on nonproliferation policy, U.S.-Russia programs, and the national security implications of technological advances for a high-tech company. Dr. Turpen has taught at Georgetown University, and has extensive teaching and lecturing experience. She is currently an adjunct professor at George Washington University's Elliot School of International Affairs. Dr. Turpen holds a PhD from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University and a BA from the University of New Mexico.
